On July 29th, 2009 local television station WOAI reported during its WOAI News4 Predator Alert segment on the status of a child sex offender wanted by the Bexar County Sheriff's Department on outstanding warrant.

On July 30th, 2009 you came across a vehicle at St. Philips College that was being operated with an equipment violation. You took steps to stop the vehicle and made contact with the driver who you discovered to be the child sex offender wanted by the Bexar County Sheriff's Department. The subject was arrested and subsequently turned over to the Bexar County Sheriff's Department and jailed.

You are to be commended for your initiative and attention to duty. As a result a wanted child sex offender was apprehended without incident and favorable recognition was brought upon yourself and the Alamo College Police Department.

SAN ANTONIO -- A child predator is off the streets. Austin Escamilla, the subject of a News 4 WOAI **Predator Alert**, has been caught.

Alamo Colleges police arrested the 24-year-old man Thursday after a routine traffic stop. He was wanted for violating his parole after sexually assaulting two little girls.

One by one, we'll try to help police get these predators off the streets.

This is the third time he's violated his sex offender registration. So how does a guy convicted of doing what he did to two innocent children keep getting chances to do it again?

In September of 2000, at just age 16, Austin Escamilla was convicted for the aggravated sexual assault on the two little girls. He did five years for that and registered as a sex offender when he got out.

But last October he violated his registration and ran from police. He did it again in January. And again in June after giving the county fake addresses.

And then Thursday, right across the street from St. Philip's College, an on-the-ball Alamo Colleges police officer made a routine traffic stop and ran the guy's plates. Turns out, it was Austin Escamilla.

Escamilla's trial is set for Monday, August 10. This time he faces anywhere from two to 20 years in prison. We'll let you know if the judge decides enough is finally enough for Austin Escamilla.
