SUBJECT: **LETTER OF COMMENDATION**

On September 7<sup>th</sup>, 2006 while working off duty at a site in the City of San Antonio each of you became aware of an aggravated robbery that had occurred at a location near the site where both of you were working.

Making note of the description of the vehicle and of the subjects involved in the incident a lookout was maintained for them. Shortly thereafter, the suspect vehicle was observed entering the parking lot at your location. The vehicle and suspects were kept under observation. SAPD was contacted and responded. After conferring with officers with the SAPD, entry was made into the restaurant and several subjects were taken into custody without incident.

As a result of your attention to duty, initiative, use of sound procedures and teamwork several suspects in a reported aggravated robbery were taken into custody and property belonging to the victims was recovered and returned.

Each of you is to be commended for your actions during this incident. As a result you have brought favorable recognition upon yourselves, the Alamo Community College District and the ACCD Department of Public Safety.

## **NEW: Off-duty cop helps in arrest of robbers**

San Antonio Police are crediting an off duty Alamo Community College police officer for the arrest of four armed robbers this morning.

Police said the officer spotted the robbers moments after they robbed two construction workers at Sugar's on the 2700 block of Northwest Loop 410.

The suspects were caught at ChaCho's restaurant right after the armed attack.

According to police, four men approached these two construction workers in the parking lot of Sugar's.

At least, two were reportedly armed with 9mm handguns.

Officers said one of the victim's was punched, and both men were robbed of their wallets and some jewelry. The suspects left the scene in an older model Cadillac.

The off duty officer working security at ChaCho's heard an alert about the robbery.

Then, the officer saw the guys come into the restaurant, which is not far from Sugar's, so he called SAPD.

The two men were arrested on charges of aggravated robbery with a deadly weapon.

According to authorities, the stolen goods were given back to the victims. Officers are still trying to recover the guns reportedly used in the robbery.
