MAJOR AND CAREER MYTHS

Most people know their major and career goals when they enter college.

Most college students don't have a clear idea of what to major in or do for a career. This is normal! The CaTS Center provides free **career counseling** to assist you in deciding on a major and career options.

There is a test that can tell me what to do with the rest of my life.

No test exists that can "tell" you what to do with your life. Instead, assessments or "tests" can help you identify your interests, skills, personality and work values. **Focus and Choices Planner Career Assessments** are tools to assist undecided majors in deciding on a major and career direction.

There is one perfect career for me.

Career satisfaction can be found in many different careers. There are a number of options based on your interests, personality type and abilities. For example if you like helping people in an artistic way you may enjoy being an art teacher or an art therapist.

I need to choose one career for the rest of my life.

It isn't typical any longer to spend a lifetime with one employer. Experts predict people will make an average of three career changes and have seven to 10 jobs in their lifetime.

It's *not* OK to be undecided.

Being undecided is normal. Engaging in exploring options can be extremely positive, leading to making an informed decision. Beginning this process of focused exploration in your first year at NVC is an important first step. **Katrice Woods Bender, Undeclared Student Team Leader**, works specifically with students who are undecided about their major.

SPOTLIGHT ON MAJOR: CRIMINAL JUSTICE
