- Unofficial copy(ies) of transcript(s) from all colleges attended. (Some programs require official transcripts; see Quick Reference Checklist)

IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SUBMIT ALL REQUIRED DOCUMENTS.

APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible to submit an application for any Allied Health program, applicants

- must meet program prerequisites identified on Quick Reference Checklist included with application form.
- must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average) on a 4.0 scale to apply for admission into a program. (Some programs require higher GPA; see Quick Reference Checklist.)

APPLICATION SUBMISSION PROCEDURE

Completed applications and supporting documents can be submitted as follows:

- Application deadlines vary by program. For application deadlines see Quick Reference Checklist included with application form.
- Place completed application with all supporting documents in a sealed envelope addressed with program name.
- Application may be returned in person to Room 118, Science Building, or mailed to address below.

ADDITIONAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS
